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Digital Preservation Outreach and Education Network: A New Life at Pratt Institute and NYU MIAP

Background

Digital Preservation Outreach & Education Network (DPOE-N) is a new initiative formed following a move in 2018 from its first iteration at the Library of Congress, where it was known as Digital Preservation Outreach & Education. In contrast to the "train the trainers" in-person courses at LoC, the new program has a more distributed model, creating a "network" of resources and provides funds for those interested in practicing digital preservation in support of cultural heritage collections. With the generous support of the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation we are able to provide monetary resources and other opportunities related to digital preservation, and build out this network since mid-2020. What follows is a report from the first year.

- Building and maintaining database of training opportunities for digital preservation
- Research and outreach into institutions eligible for funding, including social media campaigns, individual outreach to institutions across the U.S., small and mid-size professional associations and HBCUs
- Gathering testimonials and surveys from past participants to gauge the success of the program and further build the network
- Expanded eligibility for COVID-19 impacted, emerging professionals
